


 Maths	Practise 2 Times Tables Multiplication Bingo 1: All players write down 5 numbers which are multiples of a given times table. For example: if you were doing the 5 times table, you might write 10, 35, 45, 50 and 60. 2: A third person can lead the game and call out multiplication questions from the chosen times table, or they can be written on cards, jumbled up in a pile for players to take turns picking and reading out. 3: If the player has an answer to the question on their bingo board, they can cross it out. First person to cross out all their numbers is the winner. It could have a number on it, a shape etc.... 2: The first player asks a question which can only be answered with 'yes' or 'no'. E.g. 'Am I odd?' 'Am I under 20?' 'Do I have 4 sides?' etc..... 3: They keep asking questions until they get the answer correct, or they run out of turns (you can set the number of turns they get at the beginning of the game). Then it is time for the other player to have a go.

Set up different stations like pillows for them to jump over, a row of chairs for them to crawl under, or a line of tape on the floor for them to walk or run on while balancing a beanbag on their head. Time them to see how they improve after each circuit.</p>	<p>RE How rules can help at home and in school. Draw and/or write about a rule which is kept or broken at home. Repeat this for rules in class, in the playground, in school, in the neighbourhood. For each situation ask: What is happening? How do people act?
