Multiplication Bingo  1: All players write down 5 numbers which are multiples of a given times table. For example: if you were doing the 5 times table, you might write 10, 35, 45, 50 and 60.  2: A third person can lead the game and call out multiplication questions from the chosen times table, or they can be written on cards, jumbled up in a pile for players to take turns picking and reading out.  3: If the player has an answer to the question on their bingo board, they can cross it out. If the word directly after the indefinite article starts with a vowel sound, then 'an' should be used (for example, 'an icecream').
