





Week Beg : 8th June 2020



This is a suggestion of a timetable for how your weeks work could look. Feel free to mix the daily activities around.

<p>Maths</p> 	<p>This week we will be exploring place value, addition, time and length. This will all be linked to the story, 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson.</p> <p>Start the week by sharing the story. This is an example on Youtube if you don't have a copy of the book. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7Jnk3XApKBg</p> <p>Our first activity is all about counting on. Draw a worm but make it look like a number line that we use in school. What number comes first? Where would number 7 go? How do you know? Which number comes between 7 and 9?</p>  <p>Now draw some other worms but choose different numbers at the start.</p>	<p>Today we will be looking at place value and counting back. It is time to get busy drawing some more worms. This time start by writing a number at the top of the worm and fill in the missing numbers by counting backwards.</p>  <p>Where will number 12 go? How do you know? Which number will come next? What is 1 less than 9? Encourage your child to use a range of vocabulary when explaining their choices - before, less than, between, count back etc.</p>	<p>Are you ready to do some measuring with worms? You can make some worms from paper, string, play dough or if you want to get messy make some colourful spaghetti worms!</p> <p>https://www.learning4kids.net/2015/07/14/bucket-of-colourful-spaghetti-worms-sensory-play/</p>  <p>Cut your 'worms' to different lengths. Talk about the length of different worms and even measure with a ruler. Order your worms by size. When comparing worms, use these words - longest, shortest, longer than and shorter than. Pick different worms and find things that are longer than, shorter than or the same length as your worm.</p>	<p>Today we will be solving addition and subtraction problems by counting on or back using a number track.</p> <p>There is a document attached for you to use or you can make your own like the one in the picture.</p>  <p>Ask your grown up to write some addition and subtraction sentences for you to solve. For example, $9 - 3 = ?$ Move your apple on to the first number, in this case number 9. Look carefully at the symbol. What does it mean? (Use a range of vocabulary, such as add, more, plus, take away, less, minus etc). Remember, if it is an 'adding' problem you move the apple forwards and if it is a 'take away' problem you move it backwards.</p>	<p>Time to get active and have a bit of counting fun.</p> <p>Superworm is many things in the story, such as a belt, a hat and a slide. Can you be like Superworm and do some counting at the same time?</p>  <p>Superworm the skipping rope. How many skips can you do in 1 minute? How long will it take you to do 20 skips? Record your estimates. Can a grown up time you? Check your counting! How many jumps can you do in 1 minute like a baby toad? Did you do more skips or jumps in a minute? How long will it take you to do 20 jumps, counting backwards this time?</p>

RF's favourite game on phonics play is 'Grab a Giggling Grapheme', can you select the correct sound when you hear it?



Play the 'Name 5 Things' game, see how fast you can list 5 things linked with the challenge card. Can you get faster each time?



Play in the same way as snakes and ladders. Land at the bottom of the go up. Land at the top of the go down.




Discuss with a grown-up what 'Good News' you have heard recently. Read 'The Jolly postman' together and talk about the Good News that is shared with the characters in the story.
