

Have some markers (books, toys etc) available, and a space to run to it safely</li> <li>2. Run to and from the marker as many times as you can in 20 seconds – ask a helper to be a timekeeper</li> <li>3. Have a rest and then do as many jumping jacks as you can in 20 seconds</li> <li>4. 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
