


# Wonders of Creation

God called the light 'day' and the darkness 'night'.

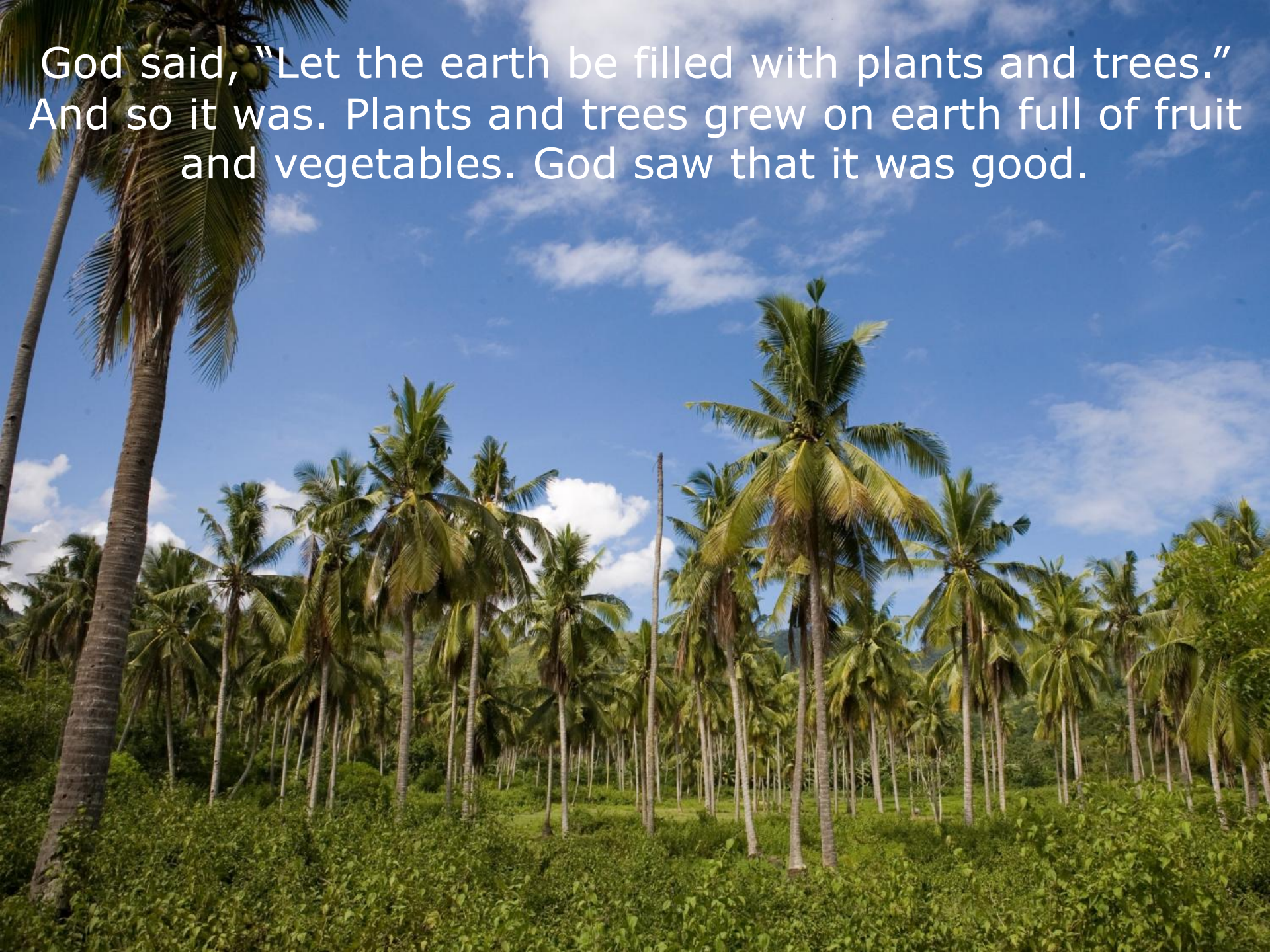




God said, "Let there be water." And so it was.
