
You start to feel drowsy. Suddenly, you hear a knock before the dentist says, "Please excuse me. I have an urgent phone call. I'll be back in a few moments."

The **first** digit on the keypad is four.



The **third** digit on the keypad is eight.

The letters e, n and o rearranged spell 'one'.

The **fourth** digit on the keypad is one.



What do all food chains start with?


All food chains start with a producer.



There are eight letters in the word producer.

The **fifth** digit on the keypad is eight.





How many of these are processes that the digestive system does?

It helps chew and swallow food.	It pumps blood around the body.	It produces bile which helps to absorb fats.	It protects your organs.
It pushes air out of the lungs.	It breaks down food into smaller pieces.	It tastes food.	It sends information to the optic nerve.

The **seventh** digit on the keypad is five.

The number of premolar teeth an adult has 8

The number of molar teeth (including wisdom teeth)
an adult has

$$8 + 4 + 8 + 12 = 32$$

$$3 + 2 = 5$$

The eighth digit on the keypad is five.
