



His mum doesn't really like looking out-side — but it's going outside that she hates. She's happier sleeping all day in-side their tower, where it's safe.





Fine (thin) or feathery.



Not ready, eager, or prepared to do something.






I have to make myself remember what I used to see: the shops and the bustle, the cars and the people, the red-brick walls of my school and the grey patch of the playground.






