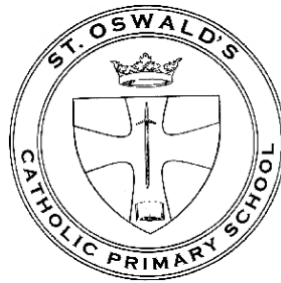

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History Catch Up Curriculum Vision

History is a key part of children's learning. A high-quality history education will help pupils gain a coherent knowledge and understanding of Britain's past and that of the wider world. It inspires pupils' curiosity to know more about the past.

At St Oswald's Catholic Primary School, we want our children to become inquisitive Historians keen to find out more. We want them to be passionate about their discoveries and excited about sharing their knowledge.

As a result of the national lockdown due to Covid-19, there are gaps in children's historical knowledge which will need to be supported and carefully planned for. Through careful questioning, we know where these gaps are and we know what must be planned to ensure these skills and knowledge are covered.

During the first half term of this academic year, teaching staff will ensure that any gaps in learning will be addressed, planned for and delivered in a History afternoon. Year groups will focus on teaching the key knowledge from the previous year group that the children were unable to access due to lockdown. History afternoon will engage and focus the children purely on History for that afternoon. They will gain knowledge missed and present this in a variety of ways across the school, such as written work, reports, posters, displays, projects and presentations.
