





Easter Message 2022

We are coming to the end of our Lenten journey. Through Lent, we have been preparing for Easter ion many different ways. Some people may have given something up, like chocolates and cakes, in order to remind ourselves of those who have less than we do. Some people may have taken something extra on, like saying extra prayers, so to have a more spiritual Lenten journey. And some people may have done both. Since Ash Wednesday, we have been following Jesus, and listening to the call to 'Repent and turn back to God'. During Holy Week, we will continue our journey, walking in the footsteps of Jesus. We will be with him as he joyfully enters Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, and we will wave palm branches and sing Hosanna to the Son of David. We will be with him as he teaches in the Temple, and we will see how Judas will decide to betray him on Spy Wednesday. On Maundy Thursday, we will celebrate as we recall how Jesus gave us the gift of the Mass, his Last Supper, and we will then watch and wait with him in the Garden of Gethsemane. On Good Friday, we will walk with him on his last journey, the Way of the Cross, as we walk to Calvary, and stand at the foot of his Cross as Jesus dies. We will mourn and weep with Mary, as we contemplate the meaning of the Tomb on Holy Saturday. But then, at the Vigil, we will gladly sing 'Alleluia! Christ is Risen!', as we celebrate the true meaning of the Cross: the gift of new life through the Resurrection. Then begins the season of Easter, a time where we continue to rejoice and be glad that Jesus has risen. Through the coming weeks, we should recall the words of Saint John Paul II, who said: "We are an Easter people, and 'Alleluia' is our song!". May "Alleluia" continue to be our song through the coming Easter season, and may the Light of the Risen Christ shine brightly within our hearts. I pray that the coming Easter feast will bring an abundance of God's blessings to all within our Parish and School Communities, and that the Risen Christ may reign in our hearts, our homes, and within our troubled world.

Updated guidance from the government states that whilst it is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional, if they were to test positive, they should not come into school and try to isolate for 3 days after the day they took the test. After 3 days, if they are well enough, they can return to school.

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend school.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
