Science	Big Question - How are materials used in our school?  Everyday materials	Big Question - Can you draw and label the main parts of a plant? Plants
	Pupils will explore, name, discuss and raise and answer questions about everyday materials so that they become familiar with the names of materials and properties.  Pupils should explore and experiment with a wide variety of materials including for example: brick, paper, fabrics, elastic, foil.	Pupils will use the local environment throughout this topic to explore and answer questions about plants growing in their habitat. Where possible, they will observe the growth of flowers and vegetables that they have planted. They should become familiar with common names of flowers, examples of deciduous and evergreen trees, and plant structures.
