





<u>A Lent message</u> <u>from Fr. Líam</u>

Easter Message 2024

Holy week gives us a chance to walk with Jesus through his last few days. We proclaim his entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, as we wave palm branches and join in the happy voices of the people singing "Hosannah to the Son of Daved, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosannah in the highest". The Last Supper is a reminder that whenever we gather at Mass, we are remembering Jesus' last supper and his commandment to his disciples "Love one another as I have loved you" and to "do tis in memory of me." We walk with Jesus on his Way of the Cross on Good Friday, where the voices that sung Hosannah, now cry out "Crucify him" and mock and jeer him. We wait in the stillness of the Tomb during Holy Saturday, preparing ourselves for the great day of Resurrection, which we celebrate on Easter Sunday, when we proclaim with the whole church: "Christ is Risen, Alleluia!" We will then celebrate for 50 days the Resurrection of Jesus, looking forward to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. May Christ, riding in glory, bring you all happiness and joy during the coming festivities. God bless. Fr. Liam




EYFS Easter blessing

All of the children across the school made fantastic efforts to decorate an egg for our whole school egg competition! Congratulations to all of the winners and runner ups from every class.
















The PTFA are always looking for new members to help out... if you think this would be something you would like to do sign up!
