
A final farewell message . from our Head Girl and Boy!

Wellbeing

This half term's Wellbeing Wednesday theme is 'Get Active'. In school we are having a focus on how physical activity can have a really positive impact on our mental health and wellbeing. By making sure we regularly move our bodies each day, we can look after both our physical and mental health at the same time. There are so many ways to get active such as walking, stretching, sports and dancing to name a few. Which is your favourite?

Measles Outbreak:

Protecting Our Community

As we come to the end of the year, it's important to highlight a <u>serious health concern</u> affecting our community: a rise in measles cases across Liverpool. Measles is a <u>highly</u> <u>contagious disease</u>, but it is entirely preventable through vaccination.

To stop the spread and protect those most vulnerable, at least 95% of the population needs to be vaccinated—this is the threshold required for herd immunity. Unfortunately, Liverpool's current vaccination rate stands at just 73%, putting many individuals, especially children, at risk.

Of particular concern is the Old Swan area, which has significantly lower vaccination rates than the city average. This makes it especially vulnerable during outbreaks.

We <u>strongly encourage</u> all families to contact their GP and check that they and their children are fully vaccinated. The MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine is safe, effective, and free through the NHS.
